Regulatory Compliance and Emissions Testing Audits

New vehicle and engine manufacturers seeking to sell their products in North America must first obtain emissions certification from regulatory agencies, including the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), California Air Resources Board (CARB), and Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC). To receive certification, manufacturers must conduct emissions testing using equipment and procedures that comply with strict regulatory requirements, including those found in Title 40 of the U.S. Code of Federal Regulations, Parts 1065 and 1066.

Trinity conducts on-site audits of emissions testing laboratories to provide an independent assessment of their ability to properly perform certification-quality emissions testing. Trinity also performs audits of vehicle coast-down facilities and the associated procedures and calculations.

As part of each on-site emissions facility audit, Trinity inspects the equipment utilized at the facility for emissions testing and verifies that equipment specifications align with regulatory requirements.

Equipment assessed during an audit includes:

- Chassis and engine dynamometers
- Evaporative SHEDs
- Exhaust emission sampling systems
- Particulate matter (PM) sampling systems and sample treatment (if applicable)
- Gaseous emissions analyzers

During each on-site audit, Trinity directly observes the procedures used for exhaust and evaporative emissions testing, as well as the required laboratory equipment performance checks. Audits also include a review of equipment maintenance, calibration, and recordkeeping practices.
